**MINUTES FOR A MEETING  
OF THE AIRPORT ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
GRANITE SHOALS CITY HALL  
THURSDAY, JULY 14, 2016 AT 6:00 PM**

1. Call to order by Chair Haverlah at 6:01 pm the regular meeting of the Airport Advisory committee of the City of Granite Shoals at Granite Shoals City Hall, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Council Chamber, 2221 N. Phillips Ranch Road, Granite Shoals, Texas 78654

2. Citizens Comments/Items of Interest

Virgil Yanta and his son, Virgil Yanta Jr., introduced themselves and explained that they had just walked the runway and taken a look around.

Jeff hunt commented that the lights were painted and repaired by Barry Sylvester and that the high voltage signs had been replaced. Everyone thanked Barry for the time and effort he had put in.

Ken Nickel commented that there are more signs on the way.

3. Discuss, consider and possibly take action to approve meeting minutes from June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Airport Advisory Committee meeting.

Sandra Buschhorn made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the June 9, 2016 Airport Advisory Committee meeting as presented. David Dittmar seconded and motion carried with unanimous vote of 7-0.

4. Discuss, consider and possibly take action related to renaming the airport in honor of the late Bob Sylvester.

Chair Haverlah stated that he thought it was a great idea and welcomed comments. There was a discussion of various names, whether there was any difference legally between calling an airport or an airpark, and if there would be any cost related to changing the name. Jeff Hunt made a motion to rename the airport the Granite Shoals/Bob Sylvester Airpark. George Forster seconded the motion and the motion passed with a unanimous vote of 7-0.

5. Discuss, consider, and possibly take action continuing the setting of a list of priorities that we hope to accomplish within the next year, as discussed in previous meeting(s).

There was an extended discussion of the possibility of record keeping of takeoffs and landings. Related ideas were presented such as, but not limited to: possibly using a counter slaved to the lights, game counters, and an electric eye set up on the windsock. Chair Haverlah recommended that we keep that in mind and move forward on the other priorities.

George Forster suggested possibly getting a run-up pad and making it out of asphalt about 15 feet square.

There was a discussion of which priorities have been taken care of and which still need to be addressed.

Jeff Hunt digitized the map that he has which shows drainage, lot numbers, access points, etc. He stated he would email it to everyone on the list. <sup>Chair</sup> Chief Haverlah stated that we still need a more accurate survey. Ken Nickel stated that we do not have GIS yet, but it is the works.

There was a discussion of what order to put the priorities in.

Tom Dillard asked if our goal was to make this airport a viable, usable and well used airfield and that the order we put our priorities in will accomplish this goal. He stated that an airfield that recoups its own cost is more viable than one that is a money pit for an elite few.

Discussion of the recommendation to be made to City Council concerning the request to change the airport from private to public at the FAA has not been presented to them yet. There was a discussion of the signage needed at the airport such as, an airport info sign, high voltage warning signs, warning sign about drop off and a midway runway marker sign. The info about the signs will be given to Ken Nickel when we receive budget money in October of 2016.

There was a discussion of the airport directory entry that George Forster created and gave to Elaine Simpson, City Secretary. It has not been given to Council or approved by the airport committee. Chair Haverlah stated that it was interesting but needed some work. A copy was passed around for everyone to take a look.

Virgil Yanta commented that he thought we have a long way to before pilots from elsewhere or newcomers like me land there. Unless you have a plane that will not be damaged from the gravel. He wondered if watering the grass would make the grass thick enough for the gravel not to matter.

George Forster discussed improvements that are needed at north end of airstrip and white washing around the lights so they could be seen easier at night. The run-up pad could be made of grass, just need to keep it watered.

There was a discussion of using sludge from the water plant on the airstrip. Ken Nickel stated that we have pretty much spent the budget for now until October when the new budget comes into effect.

Discussion of things that get put on agenda at city council.

Ken Nickel made a suggestion that Chair Haverlah make a report to the city council about our status and it was discussed what to include in the report.

Barry Sylvester suggested that the appearance of the airport needs to be improved and that we maintain what we have. He would also like to see as an item on the priorities that we provide the city with a maintenance plan so the city knows what needs to happen.

There was a general discussion of the pros and cons involving volunteers doing the maintenance as opposed to the city workers. Liability issues, etc.

Sheryl Gardner made a motion to provide a detailed maintenance plan-as detailed as we can-to the City. What needs to be done and how it needs to be done. Then we can contact them as we need to with anything else. Chair Haverlah stated he would get with Barry Sylvester and try to get something worked up. There was a more detailed discussion of possibly signing a waiver and letting us do some of the work since the city really doesn't have that knowledge.

The motion was seconded by Sandy Buschhorn .

More discussion as to the climate affecting the schedule and what is an acceptable length of grass. George Forster resigned his position and left the meeting stating there was too much talk and not enough getting done. The motion passed with 5-1 Jeff Hunt opposed it.

Chair Haverlah called for a ten minute break starting at 7:15pm.

Chair Haverlah called the meeting back in order at 7:27pm.

6. Discuss, consider and possibly take action related to reviewing paperwork needed to request a change in airport classification with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

There was a discussion of which paperwork needed to file change with the FAA. 7480-1 is the Change of Use form according to Jeff Hunt's research and that a call would be needed to be made to Bill Gunn at 512-416-4507. There was some further discussion of George Forester's letter and what to do with it.

Tom Dillard made a process recommendation for the council to authorize the staff to do a change of use.

It was also discussed and decided that sending info to AirNav.com would accomplish nothing and that if we worked the process through TX-Dot and the FAA that the info will get to all the private directories. So all that needs to be done is to get the council to approve the change of use.

It was decided that Chair Haverlah would make the report to the City Council and include in that report a recommendation to authorize a change of use for the airport.

There was a discussion of what needs to be in report and what questions he needed to be ready to answer.

7. Discuss, consider and possibly take action to gather information on specifications/information/photos to present to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Chair Haverlah stated that he met with Ken Nickel and the two code compliance officers, Preston Williams and Mike Bishop. The following is a summation from that meeting.

They will permit a hanger house. But the living quarters inside a hanger must be 1200 square feet. This is on the east side which is R-1. On the west side you can have a hanger with a mobile home, or a hanger with a house with at least 1000 square feet. ~~But you can't have a hanger house and you can't live in your hanger.~~ If you have a mobile home it must be five years old or less and you cannot connect the hanger directly to the mobile home. On the west side you can also construct a new hanger home with the living quarters inside as long as it complies with all the existing codes, fire codes and maintenance rules. The design will have to be approved by the code compliance officers. Case by case will be looked over. There are also no limitations on the size of any hangers or garages being built at this time.

You also cannot camp on your property in the city limits.

There was discussion of airport storage facilities. Which are not permissible at this time under current zoning regulations.

Discussion of how much room the city owns to put tie-downs and hail sheds on either side of runway. Possibly to promote the use of airport for fly-in storage. The potential for the city to make money from these ideas.

There was a discussion of whether you could rent your hanger out and whether that became a home based business. It was decided that was probably a question the city attorney could answer:

The general consensus was that we do not need to go to the Planning and Zoning Committee at this time. There are no impediments to building a hanger home as long as you take your plans to be approved by code compliance.

## 8. Future Agenda Items

Options for run-up pad, decide on one and figure out how to get it accomplished.

Improve our tools for info on airport.

Jeff hunt will email out the digitized maps to everyone.

Get a detailed maintenance plan for the City Manager

Also get details on signage: size - what - where

Work on getting items donated for projects

Barry Sylvester will take photos for possible run-up pad and also take some pics of the drainage ditch for possible location of sludge fill. He will also look at sludge to see if it is feasible to use.

There was a motion by Chair Haverlah to skip the next meeting in August. Sheryl Gardner seconded the motion and it was unanimous by a vote of 6-0.

This committee was established by City Council to maintain operational data and gather information on the airport to develop plans for maintenance, improvements, and future sources of revenue and uses of the airport. Review planning and zoning to ensure compatibility with the City's Comprehensive Plan and report to the city Council per ORD 686. Our Council Liaison is Mayor Pro Tem Tom Dillard.

First meeting was held April 14, 2016. Nominations were made and passed to elect:

In this organizing meeting we discussed and looked at zoning maps, airport map, airplane tie-down locations, possible sources of revenue and future items- Beacon, radio communication to coordinate with Sunrise Beach Airport, and need for signs.
