
Heritage Tree Proclamation and Photo Contest

Committees

Community Cat Advisory Committee: The Community Cat Advisory Committee (CCAC) had a productive meeting on Monday, April 15th. We are excited to share that the committee recently completed a successful small-scale Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) effort behind the Dollar General on 1431. Between April 9-11th, several cats were trapped, transported, and sterilized at the Hope Animal Clinic. We're happy to report that all cats were safely returned to the area where they were trapped, contributing to a healthier and more sustainable community for our feline friends.

The next CCAC meeting is scheduled for May 13, 2024. We look forward to continuing our efforts to improve the well-being of community cats.

Wildlife Advisory Committee: Wildlife Advisory Committee (WAC) is actively working on organizing and planning for future activities related to deer management and conservation. By holding workshops, the committee is taking important steps to prepare for future deer count surveys, determine harvest locations, and organize the necessary training and inventory.

This kind of planning and preparation is essential for effective wildlife management, as it allows the committee to collect accurate data on deer populations, assess the impact of hunting, and ensure sustainable practices are followed. Additionally, providing training to volunteers and personnel involved in these activities helps maintain consistency and accuracy in data collection and management. The next WAC meeting is scheduled for May 6, 2024

Parks Committee: The Parks meeting on April 4, 2024, focused on discussing park needs, recent accomplishments, the parks budget, and maintenance requirements. The next Parks meeting is scheduled for May 2, 2024.

Recent and upcoming park projects include:

- Barrier rocks were placed at Crockett Park to enhance safety and aesthetics.
- The playground at the Community Center is set to receive a refresh of engineered wood fiber, improving playability for our community members.
- A new restroom facility has been installed at Timber Hill Park, providing added convenience for park visitors.
- We've selected a location at Veteran's Park for a memorial tree in honor of Jack King, a valued member of our community.



Thank you to everyone involved in these projects for their dedication to improving our parks and enhancing the quality of life for Granite Shoals residents!

Board of Adjustments: The Board of Adjustments (BOA) meeting took place on March 18th, 2024. Moving forward, future BOA meeting dates will be scheduled as requests are made.

Charter Education Committee: The Charter Education Committee has been hard at work preparing a trifold that details the upcoming amendments that will be on the ballot. You can pick up these informative trifolds at the billing office in City Hall anytime prior to Election Day.

- City Vehicle Damage: The recent hailstorm caused damage to several City vehicles.
 We have identified 5 Police, 1 Utility, and 1 Park vehicle with hail damage and/or
 broken windshields. Inspections are ongoing to assess other City equipment and
 facilities.
